<u>May Council Meeting</u>: TD&H was present to discuss the water project. The Notice of Award goes to DJB Construction of Wenatachee. Their bid was for \$414,790, the next bid was \$150,000 more. We are anticipating a mid-June start date.

**NUISANCE REPORT:** Council has cleaned up the 3<sup>rd</sup> street project either by putting items in the garage or filling a dumpster. They also had the Lion's Club pick up trash. All fees will be charged against the property.

CP would like Council to follow through more with Nuisance yards. We continue to have the same people with the same problem time after time. Council instructed Jeanette to send the four different ordinances to Josh Grant to review and make sure they were still valid and enforceable.

CP is helping Darrell with the Nuisance Officer position and will be cracking down once the ordinances have been reviewed. They will enforce the ordinances.

**<u>UPDATES BY STAFF</u>**: The 4-H kids picked up trash around town. Bags, pickers, gloves and vests were provided by the Lincoln County Transfer Station.

Jeanette attended the Annual Report class put on by BIAS Software in Spokane. AWC Risk Management provided a \$500 scholarship for the class.

Weaver Exterminating has been servicing the cemetery.

Jeanette purchased new phones for Town Hall for \$40. The old ones were not holding a charge any more.

The printer in the office hadn't been working correctly for a couple days. When it jammed and caught the paper on fire we curbed it and bought a new one.

The Lion's Club completed their trash pickup. Only 38 people took advantage of the service.

AWC Risk Management gave us a grant to pay for the blade for the new tractor. This will alleviate risk by being able to plow sidewalks in the winter. The cost was \$726.

Brent reported they have repaired numerous leaks around town.
