TOWN OF ALMIRA COUNCIL MEETING June 9th<sup>th</sup>, 2020.

Steve Bechtol, Fordair Wireless discussed more options on putting in wireless internet for Almira. He is looking for a place to set up towers to bounce the signals off of. He asked if we could find out approximately how many people would be interested in the service. Installation will run between \$150 - \$200 and monthly fee would be \$50.

Chief Dennis Pinar came to speak to the council. With four new members he gave a brief fire history and how the town contracts with the Fire District for service. Most calls in town are EMS; the department has about 50 runs a year with ¾ of them being in Almira. We purchased our ambulance a few years ago used and are looking at replacing it in about 3 years.

**NUISANCE REPORT:** CP has sent out a couple more letters with 30 day time frames to clean up or they will be fined \$100. She has also spoken with the Health Department regarding houses that are unlivable.

<u>UPDATES BY STAFF:</u> Jeanette has been doing a lot of Covid related things: webinars, rules, grants and resolutions.

We read meters for the first time, there were a couple homeowners with leaks. They were notified and the leaks were repaired.

We have had multiple compliments to the guys on how great the cemetery looked for Memorial Day.

After many years of service from Weaver exterminating we decided to trim the Cemetery budget and Brent and Dave are trapping gophers/moles/rodents. The first week they caught 13!!! Hopefully this will solve the problem

They are planting grass by the shop to keep the dust down and improve the looks of the lot around the recycling bins.

**OLD BUSINESS:** CenturyWest Engineering was chosen as our Engineer for the upcoming Sewer projects.

Information was provided to the council on formally forming a Planning Commission. Council decided to ask the community for volunteers to be on the committee as opposed to asking people we would see who was interested. Once we get volunteers we will move on with the other formalities.

Staff will work on the completion of the Six Year plan.

<u>NEW BUSINESS:</u> Jason thought it would be nice to have a council meeting at the Community Center as a "meet and greet" for the community to meet the Mayor and Council since we have four new members appointed this year. It was decided to wait until the September 8th meeting to host this event.

**<u>BUILDING PERMITS:</u>** Two roofing, a garage and a fence permit were requested, all were approved.
