NUISANCE REPORT: Levi will be reaching out to people needing to clean up and reminding them about the upcoming Lion's Club Clean up.

<u>UPDATES BY STAFF</u>: The transfer station will have someone here Friday, May 6^{th} from 9 – 11 a.m. for toxic waste pickup; they will be located by the recycling bins.

We had our exit conference with the auditor.

Brent had received one bid for surveying the town. The firm would fly a drone over town and make a high resolution map showing boundaries. The bid was \$10,000 and would include the software to look at it. He has also contacted another firm for a price. We haven't found any grants as of yet to help pay for it.

The cemetery had a leak and they have been repairing it, still waiting on parts.

When we had a funeral a week ago Wilbert Precast drove through the cemetery with their truck and trailer causing substantial damage. Brent contacted them and they will be coming out to repair all the damage.

OLD BUSINESS: Brent and Jeanette met with John Quinn, Century West and Department of Health. We were working on a General Sewer Plan and then it was suggested that we just do an Engineer Report. Brent

suggested we move forward with the full report as it makes us eligible for more grants. Council agreed that was the best way to go.

Council also discussed moving forward with the project to replace the lift station. We continue to have small problems and parts are getting harder to find because of the age of the system. We need to be proactive in replacing it instead of waiting for something to happen and having a huge expensive problem. The cost of the lift station project is over \$500,000. We have been approved for a loan from Department of Health with \$30,000 in forgivable funds. We will also have \$80,000 in CARES funds and money from reserves to put toward the project. Rates will have to go up to make the loan payments. Brent is also exploring some other funding options.

Jason gave an update on the IFiber visit. They were looking at different spots to put the equipment in town. They will likely put in a small building in the fenced area at the new water tower.

<u>NEW BUSINESS</u>: The school is in need of a conditional use permit because the height of the new school will be higher than the building ordinance allows.

Ordinance 572 closing the streets and alleys on Barton's property south of Highway 2 was discussed and approved.

<u>STATUS OF UTILITY ACCOUNTS:</u> 13 water off notices were sent out the end of March. Two had their water turned off for lack of payment.

The next Council Meeting is May 10th, 2022 at 7 pm Public Hearing for Conditional Use Permit for School Please attend and have an input in our community.
