OCTOBER COUNCIL MEETING:

GUESTS: Scott Hutsell, County Commissioner

Scott brought up the draft agreement for the town for the upcoming Fiber Optic project. Scott explained the installation plan and all the grants they have been awarded for this project. He is extremely optimistic that Almira will have Fiber Optic by the end of 2023. The agreement will be sent to the Town attorney for review.

NUISANCE REPORT: Levi made a couple of face to face visits about nuisance issues.

<u>UPDATES BY STAFF:</u> Jeanette has been working on the budget.

Meters have been read for the last time this year.

Brent is looking for grants to fix the roads around the school when the project is completed. He is meeting with the project manager on Thursday to see what exactly the school is paying for so we can work on the rest of the funding needed.

Copenhaver is supposed to be sweeping 5th street with their big sweeper since our sweeper isn't big enough to do any good.

<u>OLD BUSINESS:</u> Chickens: Only one person has been in to purchase a permit for having chickens. We had about \$160 in legal fees getting the ordinance amended.

Belsby Engineering has been notified to move forward with surveying the town. They weren't sure when they would be able to get it done.

Lincoln County Sheriff was called regarding a dog nuisance and the officer emailed Jeanette to get a hold of District court for service so we can make city ordinances citable. Jeanette has contacted them to get this project started.

We are one signature away from our USDA tool grant being funded. The USDA grant is for \$10,500 worth of tools after we spend \$8,654. We will be purchasing mini splits for town hall with our portion we pay. This should make a big difference on the electric bill since there is currently just three wall heaters.

<u>NEW BUSINESS</u>: The Department of Ecology kick off meeting for the Lift Station project is scheduled for October 31st, council was invited to sit in on the zoom meeting. Jeanette discussed some financials regarding

the project with those in attendance. It was decided to wait until everyone could be present to make a decision. A special meeting has been planned for October 17th at 5:30 pm.

BUDGET: Jeanette has been working on the budget and is optimistic that we can leave utility rates alone, especially since we had to increase sewer and garbage this year already. Wages were briefly discussed and tabled.

BUILDING PERMITS: One building permit for a window.

STATUS OF UTILITY ACCOUNTS: 23 water off notices were sent. Five accounts were shut off and had to pay in full to get the water back on. One account is still off and all others made payments.
