NUISANCE REPORT: Levi received a couple written complaints so would be addressing the problems.

UPDATES BY STAFF: Jeanette is able to notarize again.

We have received \$950 in memorial donations for the Cemetery in memory of Iva Felker.

He has been researching speed signs for town. (Like Wilbur's) They will be about \$2500 each and we want three. He hopes to use Risk Management grant money for the purchase.

Brent inquired about building a wood fence around the trash cans in the park so they looked better. Council approved.

The state has been requiring a lot of extra water samples the last few months.

OLD BUSINESS: Chickens: The Amendment to the animal ordinance was read, corrected and approved Brent had previously discussed with Council having the Town's property surveyed. Streets, shop, wells, parks and all Town property. He has received two bids, both for about \$10,000 from Belsby Engineering and Coffman. Council chose Belsby because of the extra detail they offered.

NEW BUSINESS: Resolution 2022-139 was drawn up to formally transfer the Corona Virus Fiscal Recovery funds to the Sewer Fund from the General Fund

Wilbur Town Hall contacted us about the possibility of sharing a Building Inspector and/or Nuisance officer. Council discussed it and decided that we couldn't guarantee any hours for anyone since we have so little building go on and we currently have a nuisance officer.

We had received a request for an upright stone at the cemetery. There is other above ground stones (2") in that row already so the individual asked. Council said no and that we were going to be firm on flat to the ground stones moving forward, per the 2010 ordinance.
